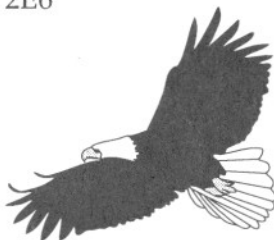

## The Project will:



1. Provide opportunities for people to learn more about Aboriginal lifestyles, giving others a better understanding and value of the culture.
2. Help students so they have success in all parts of their school life.
3. Help families understand individual and family wellness, and show how they can work toward this.
4. Plan or support activities in the community, encouraging students and their families to attend. By doing this, it will give the students and their families a chance to feel they are a part of the community.
5. Help people and service providers in the Aboriginal community see that by working together we will be stronger and have better success.
6. Make sure the needs of Aboriginal students and families are seen as important. Create programs to meet those needs.
7. Provide teachers and schools with learning materials which explain Aboriginal lifestyles and beliefs in an appropriate and correct way.
