The Red Cross Personal Disaster Assistance Team may provide emergency food, clothing, accommodation and personal services for up to 72 hours to individuals and families following an assessment, who have been affected by local, small-scale disasters such as house fires or sewage backup.

Canadians say they have not taken steps to prepare in the event of a disaster.

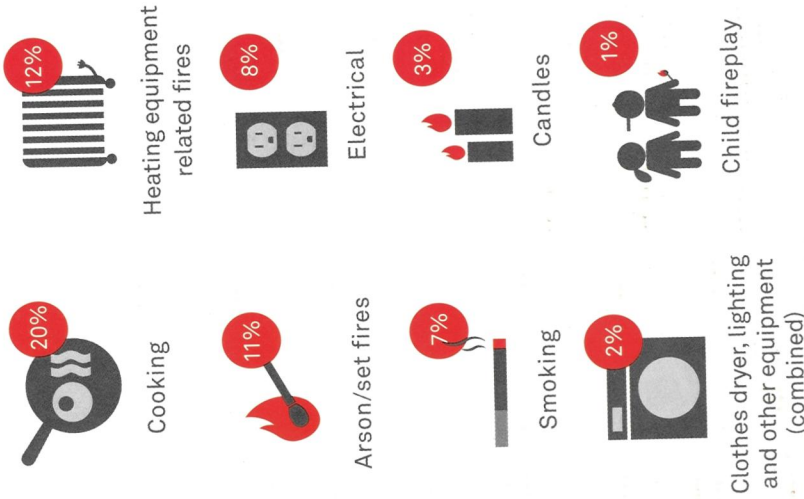
Red Cross in Alberta responds to an average of

KEEP YOUR FAMILY SAFE

Some basic steps you may want to take

If you cannot stay in your home due to fire or flood damage, you will need temporary housing for your family and any pet.

- Contact your insurance company and let them know what has happened.
- If you are a tenant, contact the owner/landlord and/or their insurance company.
- You may be eligible for Red Cross 72 hour personal disaster assistance. Call our 24/7 disaster assistance line at 1-888-800-6493 for help.
- Contact your local authorities for more information related to available assistance programs.
- Consider the clean up requirements.
