

### Legal Clinics

We offer free and confidential legal advice in various communities in Central Alberta on legal issues such as:

- Landlord/Tenant
- Employment
- Criminal Law
- Family law
- Wills and Estates
- Small Claims/Debt
- Traffic/Bylaws
- Personal Injury

You must book an appointment to see a lawyer. Legal advice is not given over the phone.

- Appointments are about 30 minutes long
- If you have a criminal matter you must get your Disclosure from the Crown's office or at your first appearance before an appointment can be booked
- Clients need to bring their own interpreter, if required
- Organize and bring important papers including court documents to your appointment
- Clients are asked to make child care arrangements as there is no onsite childcare

### Follow-Up Program

After receiving summary legal advice at a clinic, clients may be referred to the Staff Lawyer for further assistance in the Follow-Up Program. Services could include more in-depth legal advice, document preparation or representation, if appropriate. Clients are required to provide proof of income to qualify for this program.



### Photo ID Program

Photo ID clinics are held monthly to provide an Affidavit of Identification to assist accessing basic local services. This ID does not replace government-issued ID. Check out our website calendar or call the office for dates.

### Wills

This program provides people with a very basic Will, Personal Directive and Power of Attorney. Clients meet with a lawyer to discuss and sign their Will.

### Tenant Support Program

This program provides information and assistance to tenants with issues such as eviction and the withholding of security deposits under the Residential Tenancy Act.

Assistance may include advocacy, application to the Residential Tenancy Dispute Resolution Service (RTDRS), including fee waivers, filing a complaint to Service Alberta or filing or defending a civil court claim with the assistance of a lawyer.

### Legal Education Sessions

We offer a number of basic information sessions about various areas of law such as Separation and Divorce, Wills & Estates, Common Law Relationships, Landlord Tenant. Check the website calendar or call the office for details and dates.
