

WHEN YOU SUSPECT A DRUG HOUSE OR CRIMINAL ACTIVITY

Contact the RCMP:

Call the RCMP & start a file number.

Contact the Crime Prevention Centre:

Resources & Information are available and the Centre works with residents and community groups to hold information meetings, community conversations.

Work with your neighbours:

Alert neighbours to the suspected criminal activity.

- Provide neighbours with the RCMP file number.
- Neighbours can quote the RCMP file number when reporting tips/information.
- Pictures/videos can be dropped off along with any written logs to the front counter at the RCMP, labelled with the case file number.

Report to Bylaws:

Compliance Officers work with residents and the RCMP on complaints related to properties suspected of criminal activity. Report unkempt yards, excessive garbage, noise bylaw.

Contact Safer Communities & Neighbourhoods

(SCAN) A unit in the Sheriff's Branch that investigates properties suspected of illegal activity.

- Report your concerns to SCAN.
- Provide the RCMP File Number.
- Criminal activity uncovered by SCAN will be turned over to the RCMP to investigate.

***Do not confront people you suspect.
Do not put yourself in a dangerous situation.***

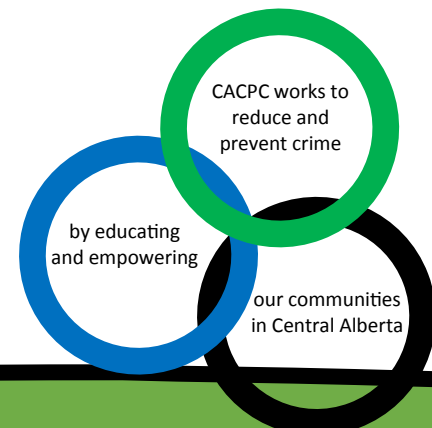
